## Quality of Education Key Priority 1 - To ensure the curriculum meets the needs of all children

- 1.1 A progressive curriculum in place in Maths
- 1.2 The quality of teaching is consistently good
- 1.3 Reading, Writing and Oracy is effectively taught across the school, so that children leave Manor Park ready for the next stage of education and any gaps between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged in reading and writing is reduced
- 1.4 The wider curriculum is developed so children will start to know and remember more as they progress through the school
- 1.5 Teachers will be supported to meet the needs of ALL children with SEND in all areas of the curriculum
- 1.6 The EYFS Statutory Framework is implemented effectively
