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Dear Parents and Carers of Reception

Welcome back to the new term here at Manor Park First School. We hope you have all had a lovely break and are ready to join us back at school. Here is some information to outline what your child will be learning this half term in all the different curriculum areas. Do encourage your child to tell you about what they have been learning at school – it really helps the children to secure their learning when they discuss it with others.

In English (communication and language, phonics, reading and writing) we are learning:



This term we are carrying on

with Pip and Pap phonics. The children will continue to learn new sounds and 'Earth words' and this will help them with their reading and writing. The children will have their books changed twice a week and will need to read at least 5 times a week.

In writing we will be focusing on the stories 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes', 'There is No Big Bad Wolf in This Story' and Spring poems.

We will:

- write some upper-case letters correctly.
- write most lower-case letters correctly using a tripod grip
- say the sound for each Phase 2 and 3 grapheme
- write CVC words and labels using Phase 2 and 3 phonemes
- spell some Earth words
- write captions
- start to write short sentences
- use finger spacing between words
- Read sentences back to an adult.

In **Understanding the World** we are learning:

All about maps! We will have a go at drawing some of our own maps from our experiences around school and also in our local community. We will have a



go at drawing maps to help Mr Wolf to buy his pancake ingredients! We will make our own pancakes - observing, measuring and recording how the materials change when combined, heated and cooled. We will also be learning about seasonal changes and looking for the signs of Spring. Local farmer Chrissy Hancock will be visiting us to help us with our learning about the life cycle of the chicken just in time for the Easter chicks and celebrations to beain.

People, Culture and Communities

- look at, and make maps, of local environment
- describe a journey within the local environment
- understand and use some language related to animals,
 e.g. camouflage, predator, nocturnal, diurnal.
- Talk about some features of a Christian Church and know that the school is connected to the church in Fordington.


Natural World


 Has a good general knowledge about living things and the natural world and can describe features of different plants and animals recognising when they are the same and different.

(PSED) we are learning:


In our Jigsaw lessons we are looking at Healthy me.

- using the words short, long and tall to talk about the length and height of objects
- talking about time, and order and sequence events

- to find representations of 9 and 10
- to compare numbers to 10
- to represent 9 & 10
- to find 1 more
- to find 1 less
- to be able to make numbers to 10

3D shapes:

- recognise and name 3D shapes
- find 2D shapes within 3D shapes
- find 3D shapes in the environment
- identify complex patterns
- copy and continue patterns


In Physical Development we are learning to:






- develop jumping and landing safely from a height
- develop rocking and rolling
- explore travelling around, over and through apparatus
- create sequences using apparatus

- use a range of tools and equipment and select the most appropriate tool or joining material for the job.

Reading books:

It is important that you read at home at least 5 times a week. We have now started to count our reads and the children will receive badges for 25, 50, 75 and 100 reads. The books will include sounds that your child has learnt and Earth words which are the words where we just haven't learnt the code yet. We will be changing books twice a week on Tuesday and Friday.
