
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
Dear families of Year 4, January 2025


Welcome back to the new term here at Manor Park First School. We hope you have all had a lovely break and are ready to get back to school. Here is some information to outline what your children will be learning this term in all the different curriculum areas. Do encourage your child to tell you about what they have been learning at school – it really helps the children to secure their learning when they discuss it with others.

In Mathematics we are learning:

Addition and Subtraction







Geometry

- Compare and classify geometric shapes, based on their properties.
- To compare, order and name angles.
- Identify lines of symmetry in 2-D shapes presented in different orientations.

Measurement (Time)

- Read, write and convert times between analogue and digital -12 and 24 hour clocks.
- Solve problems involving converting from hours to minutes, minutes to seconds, years to months, weeks to days.
- Convert between different unit of measure (for example hours to minute)








In **English** we are learning to:

- Write a setting description using the language from The Great Kapok Tree
- Continue the story of The Great Kapok Tree, detailing what the character did next as a result of his experience in the rainforest
- Write a persuasive letter to the president of Brazil about the deforestation of the Amazon rainforest
- Create and write an information leaflet on the Amazon rainforest and the importance of looking after the rainforest





In **RE** we are Looking at People of God-what is it like to follow God and Gospel-What kind of world did Jesus want? We will:

- Make connections between the story of Noah and the idea of covenant.
- Make links between the promises in the story of Noah and the promises that Christians make at a wedding.
- Make links between the story of Noah and how we live in school and the wider world.
- Give clear, simple accounts of what bible texts mean to Christians.

In Art we are learning about self portraits using the work of

- Become an independent Artist
- Vary the thickness of lines when sketching and painting
- Build up layers of colour
- Work on top of a background
- Variety of line strokes (free-flowing, sweeping, broken, faint & hard)
- Select an appropriate brush size and type
- Mix and match colours





In **PE** we are developing our

Dance skills

- create characters through movement and gesture.
- use inspiration from a range of stimuli
- work in groups, pairs and independently
- think about how to use movement to communicate ideas and feelings.
- develop confidence when performing.


Netball skills

- develop passing and moving within the footwork rule
- defend an opponent and intercept
- shooting action
- apply skills and knowledge to play games using netball rules



In **Geography** we are learning:

- To indicate different climate zones (tropical, temperate and polar), and describe their characteristics.
- Name countries where rainforests are found.
- Describe the location of rainforests (near the equator)



- To be able to talk about the animals and plants found in each layer of the rainforest
- To understand and explain deforestation along with the issues surrounding it



In PSHE we are learning about Dreams and Goals:

- Talk about our hopes and dreams.
- Plan and set new goals in achievable steps.
- Explain what it means to be resilient and to have a positive attitude.
- Reflect on positive and happy experiences and how they can help counteract disappointment.
- Cope with disappointment and help others cope with theirs.

In Music we are learning: singing

- Learn the importance of warming up the voice.
- Develop a sense of pitch through scalic warm-ups.
- Learn to sing a round in two (or more) parts.
- Learn to sing a song with layered vocal accompaniment.
- Learn to be more confident at holding a part when others are singing something different.
- Understand what makes a good performance.





In **French** we are learning.

- Words for key shapes and colours
- Learn how to describe where things are in pictures.
- To learn parts of the face and body.



In **Computing** we are learning:

- To identify that accuracy in programming is important
- To create a program in a text-based language
- To explain what 'repeat' means
- To modify a count-controlled loop to produce a given outcome
- To decompose a task into small steps
- To create a program that uses count-controlled loops to produce a given outcome

Additional class information:

Spelling

Spelling tests will take place in Year 4 on a Friday and the new list will be taught throughout the week. Please make sure your child frequently practises spellings from previous weeks to ensure retention of learned words.

Reading

Reading on a daily basis is very important in Year 4. Please encourage your child to read **daily**. Children are rewarded with **reading badges** for reading 25, 50, 75, 100, 150 and 200 times. One entry per day counts towards the badge. Please record your child's reading on their digital reading log (Learning with Parents), which we will check weekly. Most children are now reading chapter books and will have the opportunity to select a new book from our fantastic library, once they finish reading their book.

Maths

Children have been given passwords to Mathletics. This is a fun, interactive and rewarding online programme that will support foundational maths and problem solving skills.

Times tables

In addition to reading every day, Year 4 children should be practising their times tables daily. All children have a log-in to TTRockstars and the expectation is that they go on this for at least 5 minutes each day. If your child does not have access to a computer or tablet to be able to do this, please let us know so that we can find time for them to practise their times tables during the day. Most Android and iOS systems support TTRockstars.

PE days

Children should come to school in their PE kits on PE days.

- Beech Class Monday and Wednesday
- Cedar Class Tuesday and Wednesday
- Oak Class Monday and Wednesday

Please make sure your child comes to school dressed in the correct PE uniform.

Children need to wear their daily black school trainers for PE.

No extra shoes are needed.
