How have we travelled the world?

English

At the start of this topic the children will be looking at and writing explanatory texts to explain the process of 'car assembly' to their reader. Once they have completed these, the children will then look at fiction writing and have the opportunity to develop their skills when writing a Warning Story based around a form of transport of their choice.

PE:

Children will have the opportunity to practise the skills and races that they will be applying on their Sports Day – 27th June. Parents are invited in the afternoon to watch the children participate.

Science:

We will cover a variety of topics in Science this half term. Children will begin by looking at Rocks and Soils, the makeup of the Earth and volcanoes. We will then have the opportunity to explore light and shadow and plants through a variety of experiments.

Jigsaw

This topic is titled 'Changing Me.' Throughout our sessions we will explore how the children's bodies and minds have changed from babies to now and how they will continue to change as they progress through puberty to adulthood. There will also be a focus on how things are going to change moving towards the next academic year.

Maths

The children will be looking at equivalent fractions. We will be gathering information to analyse and produce graphs to show our findings. The children will also be exploring 3D shapes as part of our topic. Times tables will continue to be practised and tested regularly. When possible please practise these at home as practise makes permanent. For children to be age related they need to achieve their silver certificate.

RE

The children will be exploring the word "pilgrimage" and what it means to people of different faiths. We will then be looking at the River Ganges and its importance to Hindus.
